

We Now OFFER **ONLINE BILL PAY:** All you need is an Internet connection through a Web browser and an e-mail address. Once you sign up for your free account and start using this service. It's simple to use. Every month we'll send you a reminder e-mail to let you know when your bill is online. Then you just log in to your account at XpressBillPay.com and view your bill. You can also see up to a full year's history of your account online, so you can compare your current bill to a year ago. You can pay with a credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer. To sign up, just go to www.hudsonwyoming.org and remember, it's free to sign up and free to use.

Skate Park: The City of Riverton has generously donated their old skate park equipment. The Skate Park will be set-up at Svilar Park. The skate park equipment will soon be here, and it is a use-at-your-own risk area. The Park is not supervised. Please NOTE: Use of the park is high risk. Protective equipment is recommended and helmets are required. Use of this park may expose the user to serious injury. Use the facility within the limits of your abilities.

ANIMALS: As a reminder all dogs and cats are required to be licensed annually in the Town of Hudson. Proof of rabies vaccination is required before a license can be issued. Licenses are \$5.00 for a neutered animal and \$7.00 for those not neutered.

LIVESTOCK: Livestock permits are required annually for all livestock. This includes chickens, ducks, and geese. You may get forms on the town website at www.hudsonwyoming.org or, a permit form may be obtained at the Hudson Town Hall.

LANDOWNERS: Are responsible for keeping their premises in an orderly manner and have their premises cleaned of trash, refuse and weeds. The brush pile will be open Wednesdays from 2:00 – 4:45 p.m., or you may call 332-3605 and let us know if you need to get in.

UNLICENSED/INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES: Vehicles are not allowed to be parked on town streets or in alleys. They must be removed from the street/alley right-of-way, and either disposed of, or moved to private property.

WHEN YOU HAVE A CONCERN ABOUT SOMETHING IN TOWN: We encourage you to come into the Town Hall and file a written complaint, so that it is on record. This enables us to look at the Ordinances, and take the proper steps to remedy the issue; which may include conflict resolution with support from the Sheriff's office, and issuance of a fine.

Mosquito Spraying is anticipated to start mid-June. PREPARING FOR MOSQUITO SEASON: A reminder to look at anything that you own outside, that can hold water. To **reduce mosquito** risks around your home: Look for standing water in and around your backyard; Drain or treat standing water; Use an aerosol or propane fogger to clear mosquito's; Treat shady areas around the house, especially around entry ways where resting mosquitoes are more likely to come indoors.
