Fire Wise Opportunity/Community Safety Awareness: Please help us work to beautify our community and make it a safe, and healthy environment. Be sure to alleviate weeds, tall grass, and any other combustible refuse. Also, the ditch that runs through your property, needs to be maintained by you. In regard to burning regulations. There are a combination of state air

pollution laws, solid waste rules and local ordinances. The Town of Hudson does not permit burning. Items such as shingles, plastics, tires and wood that have been chemically treated should never be burned. There is good reason for this rule – burning such items can create toxic fumes that contaminate the air, so please seek safe alternatives. The best alternatives are reuse or recycling of materials. Under statewide law, burning the following materials is prohibited under any conditions: 1.) wet, combustible garbage or rubbish including wet cardboard or paper, oily substances, including oily or greasy rags, oil filters, etc.2.) asphalt products such as shingles or tar paper 3.) plastics of any kind, including plastic bottles, packaging materials and plastic bags 4.) rubber products, including tires and hoses 5.) treated or painted wood. The Town would be happy to support you, as well as we encourage you to contact The Department of Environmental Quality (307) 777-7931, or Environmental Solid Waste Management 332-6924, with questions.

August 21st, SOLAR ECLIPSE: Plan on protecting your vision using eclipse glasses, normal sunglasses are unsafe for viewing. Also, have your basic household needs purchased in advance of this event. It is being reported that an estimated 10,000 travelers will be coming to our county during this time, increasing demands for fuel, basic groceries, water and supplies. If projections are true, there may be a shortage of such products during the days before and following the eclipse. BRUSH PILE: Please remember that *only lawn debris, trees and branches, and brush and weeds may be dumped into the brush pile.* There are to be no fence posts, lumber, building demo, personal garbage, cans, metal or plastic placed in the pile.

Mosquito's: Spraying continues. A reminder to look at anything that you own outside, that can hold water. To **reduce mosquito** risks around your home: Look for standing water in and around your backyard. Drain or treat standing water. Use an aerosol or propane fogger to clear mosquito's Treat shady areas around the house, especially around entry ways where resting mosquitoes are more likely to come indoors.
