MAYOR OFFICE HOURS

TOWN COUNCIL MEETING: The next meeting will be Tuesday, July 10th at 6p.m.

Town, Flushing of Fire Hydrants will take place the week of July 17th. The flushing will start at 8:00a.m. and continue throughout the day. After flushing, your water may be red and dirty for a time. In order to clear your water, let your cold-water tap run for several minutes until clear water is restored. You may want to prepare to have water on hand prior to the flushing.

Please CONTROL your animals: It is not permissible to let them roam around or be off your property, without you present. Town Ordinance #811 and the Town Code Sec 1-5. penalties may be found on the town website www.hudsonwyoming.org or you may come by the Hall and pick up a copy. The Sheriff's office (332-5611) is working with the Town to enforce rules. Please do not call the Sheriff's office on minor incidents (let the Town know), yet, if it is an incident of aggression or constant disturbance, then please call.

Mosquito's: In spraying for mosquito's we try to accommodate special requests for no spray. However, should a report come back showing a mosquito trapped, that has a virus, we are mandated to spray everywhere. Also, please look outside, around your home, for any area that gathers standing water. Be sure to drain or treat standing water. Use an aerosol or propane fogger to clear mosquito's. Treat shady areas around the house, especially around entry ways, where resting mosquitoes are more likely to come indoors.

Water/Sewer Accounts: The Town has online bill pay, which is free to use. Go online and sign up for AUTO PAY www.hudsonwyoming.org or www.xpressbillpay.com or call in with your credit card information. You may also drop your payment in the slot at the front door of the Hall if the office is not open. Please make sure your payment is to the Town Hall by the 20th. Thank you! In an effort to not raise rates all at once, in 2016, the town implemented a 25cent increase to both water and sewer every 6 months, which you will notice on your current bill.
