

The Town Cemetery was honored this past month with a generous donation from Tony Berce; whose parents are laid to rest here in Hudson. Tony was a Hudson boy who joined the Navy as a young man. His nephew, Robert Calfas came to Hudson the week of September 17th, and presented \$64,890 on behalf of his Aunt Louise and late Uncle

Tony. The money is being used for improvements at the cemetery.

KENNEL PERMITS: If you own more than 3 dogs, you are required to apply for a kennel permit on a yearly basis, with May being the start date of the annual year. The cost of the permit is \$50.00 yearly.

LIVESTOCK PERMITS: A livestock permit is required annually for all livestock be it chickens, ducks, geese, rabbits, horses, cows, llamas, donkeys, pigs, etc. A permit form may be obtained at the Hudson Town Hall at 333 South Main or you can go online to Forms at www.hudsonwyoming.org. If mailing your application to the Hall, please include payment and use P.O. Box 56 Hudson, WY 82515.

The Kansas Avenue Paving Project: Has been awarded to Dave's Asphalt out of Riverton. Work will soon commence on Kansas street and approximately 600 feet will be paved up at the cemetery as well. There will be a brief meeting on Monday Oct. 1st at 7p at the Town Hall.

JUNIOR JAZZ BASKETBALL: DATES: October 11th to mid - December. Do feel free to come in and browse the Closet anytime the Hall is open. Help yourself to items contained within the perimeter of the Closet. All items are received through donations. **To DONATE:** Items need to be free from stain/rips, in working condition, and small items that contain all their pieces and parts. We do have gift certificates from the Methodist Thrift Shop, available for the Lander location if you know of someone that could use a certificate. **AGAIN, PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE ITEMS OUTSIDE OF THE HALL.** Unfortunately, a few items have been dropped off that have had to be hauled to the dump, adding an expense to the Town. **We want to be able to keep the Closet open, so please make sure the items you donate will be able to serve the needs of others. Thank you!**

Water/Sewer Accounts: The Town has online bill pay, which is free to use. Go online and sign up for AUTO PAY www.hudsonwyoming.org or www.xpressbillpay.com or call in with your credit card information. You may also drop your payment in the slot at the front door of the Hall if the office is not open.

METER READ PAD AND/OR METER PIT's: It is generally around the 20th of each month that meters are read.

Please continue to check the area around your meter, and confirm there are no weeds, debris, ice, snow, or anything else that would make it unsafe for our reader to access. Additionally, if you have pets, please make sure they are confined to where our reader can safely access the town's meter. **WHEN YOU HAVE A CONCERN ABOUT SOMETHING IN TOWN:** We encourage you to come into the Town Hall and file a written complaint, so that it is on record. You may also go online at www.hudsonwyoming.org and grab a victim/witness statement form from the FORM tab. This enables us to look at the Ordinances and take the proper steps to remedy the issue; which may include conflict resolution with support from the Sheriff's office. **Hudson**

It is due to her willingness and special effort to keep the library organized, that the library doors are generally open at least three times weekly in the afternoons on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday's. Additionally, The Fire Department wants to remind you, that Fire Prevention week is upon us, and it's important to check your smoke alarms and ensure they are in working condition, replacing batteries when necessary. If you have any questions or concerns on fire safety, please contact the Fire Department at 332-3264. Please note: Smoke alarms should be replaced every 10 years. **To find out how old a smoke alarm is, look at the date of manufacture on the back of the alarm; the alarm should be replaced 10 years from that date.**
