

SATURDAY May 18th, for two hours, ANNUAL ANIMAL LICENSING/VACCINATION CLINIC: *Dr. Richard Boulette of Wind River Veterinary Clinic is kind enough, to once again travel to Hudson, to complete vaccinations. Please take advantage of this great local opportunity and be sure to mark your calendars right now for May 18th 9-11a.m., two hours only. Wind River Vet 108 Tweed Lane, Lander, WY 82520. The clinic will be held on **Saturday, May 18th from 9:00 to 11a.m. at the Hudson Town Hall.** As per Ordinance #811, Section 4-15 **all dogs and cats** must be registered on a yearly basis. License tags for non-neutered animals are \$7.00/year and \$5.00/year for neutered animals. **To license your animal, a proof of current rabies certificate is required. New tags will be issued this year, and they are to be on your animal, if they are outside at all. If your animal wanders off and no tag is on them. You will need to purchase a license and tag for them or present the issuance proof and tag previously purchased before you leave with them.**

Auto Pay for your water/sewer bill: If you have not already signed up for auto pay, you might consider doing so. Those who have, really appreciate that they know their bill will be paid timely, on a specific day of the month, so that they no longer must remember to have it physically turned in prior to the 20th. You also control the amount pulled each month; you are encouraged to set a dollar amount of \$74.00 or whatever you would like your limit to be. Hudson's Closet: It's that time of year when many of you will be doing spring cleaning. As you go through items, please keep in mind Hudson's Closet. PREPARING FOR MOSQUITO SEASON: A reminder to look at anything that you own outside that can hold water and drain or treat the standing water. Use an aerosol or propane fogger to clear mosquito's and treat shady areas around the house, especially around entry ways where resting mosquitoes are more likely to come indoors.

WY DOT will begin the HUDSON – RIVERTON project soon. Paving will begin at the northern limits of Hudson and extend north along the existing highway route. The project will add two eleven-foot passing lanes, a 1" hot plant mix leveling course, 2" hot plant mix overlay, followed by chip sealing for a distance of approximately seven miles.

BRUSH PILE: The brush pile is open. Please remember that only lawn debris, trees and branches, brush and weeds may be dumped into the brush pile. **No fence posts, lumber, building demo, personal garbage, cans, metal or plastic, should be placed in the pile.**
